PASTOR'S MESSAGE

FOOD FOR THOUGHT....a note from your Pastor

For auld lang syne, my jo, For auld lang syne, We'll take a cup o' kindness yet, For auld lang syne. And surely ye'll be your pint-stowp! And surely I'll be mine! And we'll take a cup o' kindness yet, For auld lang syne.

This famous poem/song, traditionally sung at the stroke of midnight on New Year's Eve, comes from the Scottish poet Robert Burns. The title, Auld Lang Syne could be translated as <u>"for old' times sake</u>" and it reminds us not to forget the friends and loved ones of our past as we move forward in the future. It is a melancholy song and I believe it is more so because we often struggle letting go of the past. There is a part of us that does not want to move forward and anything that represents change is difficult. But change is unavoidable; times waits for no one, the adage reminds us. Perhaps how we deal with the change is the key to how much we grow.

Along those lines, I propose that this body of faith, Immanuel, move forward in Christ by undergoing a **Vitality and Renewal** program. The program involves a congregational vitality survey designed to identify strengths and growth areas, discussion starters regarding renewal, how to read the survey, outlines to create and implement a congregational plan in each area and follow up evaluations to assess growth.

I hope that we can undertake this project beginning in January, 2018 and continue to utilize these tools to become a stronger, healthier congregation as we grow into God's plan for us. Look for more information coming your way as we move forward.

We all struggle with change at some point in our lives and the same struggle can happen in our faith community. What I'm suggesting is that we manage the change by being proactive and anticipating what new things God might be calling us to in this body of Christ known as Immanuel. It can be frightening, but at the same time it is exhilarating to know that God has a plan for us to reach out more and more with the Gospel and to proclaim release to those in prison, hope to the hopeless and new life to those who live in darkness. The good news is for all people and our mission is to share that message with everyone possible. Most often, that requires reaching out beyond where we might be comfortable.


