PASTOR'S MESSAGE

FOOD FOR THOUGHT....a note from your Pastor 'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine-grower. ²He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes[±] to make it bear more fruit. ³You have already been cleansed[±] by the word that I have spoken to you. ⁴Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. ⁵I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. John 10

Recently, my family and I borrowed an incubator to hatch some fertile eggs and have some new chicks this spring to add to our flock. Kaydee has been paying close attention to the eggs; turning them twice a day, singing to them and marking their progress on a website that is all about chickens. Each day, although we cannot see it, the chicks are progressing in their stages of life, preparing to break forth from their shells and begin their lives outside of their birthplace.

As we move forward into spring and closer to the celebration of our Lord's resurrection, I would like to take this moment to remind you; YOU belong to God! Whether you are here or there, young or old, short or tall, you belong to God and God is doing something incredible in your life. There may be seasons of our lives that we do not *recognize* that God is busy making all things new or bringing to fruition God's plans for our lives. But just because you cannot see the seed below the ground, does not mean it is not growing. God is in the business of bringing forth new life, especially when it seems there is none.

I believe the same thing is happening in our faith community here. (Immanuel) I believe that God is bearing fruit through our generosity, ministry, time, talent and dedication to the Gospel. God is using us to bring about God's kingdom plan and what God desires will always come about. God's will cannot be thwarted.

Recently, some of us took a Congregational Vitality survey. It was a snapshot of how you feel the church is doing in areas such as worship, conflict resolution, welcoming new folks and social justice. Although the number of respondents was fairly small, (37) the survey pointed to a couple things; we are doing many things well, such as our worship life and reaching out to be a positive force in the community. But we also have room to grow in some areas such as conflict resolution, connecting people to ministry and equipping folks with the tools they need to boldly witness to the amazing things God is doing in our lives. All this to say that our congregation is mission minded and expressing signs of vitality in many areas. Even when we don't see them, we can be assured that God is bringing forth fruit from our efforts. Remember, God is all about making all things new!

PASTOR'S MESSAGE continued:

I don't want to give you the impression that our work is complete or that we can rest on our success; the harvest is still plentiful and sometimes the laborers are few. But we are connected to the vine that is Jesus Christ and God is bringing forth a harvest of our lives even as the winter gives up to spring. Abide in the vine, bear fruit for the kingdom and you will bear witness to the power of God to bring life from that which was dead!

We had the opportunity to share our hopes for Immanuel and I'd like to thank you for sharing your thoughts. We're fortunate that so many are enthusiastic about Immanuel.

During the cottage and ministry meetings conversation focused on different topics. *How we can strengthen our Christian education and youth group?* Most agreed that we should be intentional in our support of a child/teen at Immanuel. Choose one to pray for, send a note so they feel encouraged and cared for.

Are we a praying church? How and when do we pray? How and when should we? If we're not comfortable, can we learn a better way to pray? Prayer should be kept in everything we do at Immanuel.

How do we become stewards of our time, talent and treasures? While we finished 2017 with positive financial stewardship we noticed some members had stepped away from roles they had served for some time.

How do we experience worship life? Worship of congregation is unique to church and is relatable across age groups and socioeconomic backgrounds. Ideas we shared included having more varied instruments during worship, having an in-house worship service at Serenity Place, having a children's choir and hosting a holiday concert with community groups.

How can we best use our facilities? Ideas we shared were enhancing the kitchen, availability of space at the 501 building, using existing space at church for mom's groups, support groups or as a center for learning.

Other shared ideas were a transportation ministry and employing a youth leader.

At our recent leadership retreat we focused on ministries we do well and how we can also improve upon them. We'll be ready to work on these as we *connect lives to Christ*.

Christmas Dinner 2017

What a blessing Immanuel is to our community. This was the recurring theme that we heard during our Christmas Day meal service. A few statistics:

Approximately 240 meals served/lives touched, including a station set up at Serenity Place Total cost of this mission: \$975.21 Volunteers involved: 30

We have been fortunate that this mission has been largely funded by donations from area merchants and Thrivent Action Team dollars. The good news is that we are in need of only about \$400 for next year!

For the 2018 dinner, we're looking for assistance from you. We will be soliciting names/addresses of those who are in need of a Christmas Day meal via the Grand Ledge Food Bank, Blessings in a Backpack, Baskets of Hope recipients and the Kids Hope folks. Do you know anyone who might be in need as well? We have been very thrifty in our spending and blessed with so many volunteers to prepare & deliver these meals, that we believe only \$400 will be needed.

Will you please prayerfully consider making a contribution now so that we won't have to solicit from the community again? You can use a pew envelop & mark it "Christmas Dinner contribution." Our hope is to secure these funds early so that when the time comes to plan & prepare for the 2018 meal, we won't have any financing issues and will be able to focus on the mission of feeding God's people.

This provides access to food for the weekend. Our congregation supports the program both financially and physically.

Another ministry we support is the Grand Ledge Food Bank. Immanuel currently has 11 volunteers working at the food bank in the kitchen preparing food orders or in the office interviewing clients. Our congregation donated approximately 1600 food items and 300 non-food items in 2017. The SNL Youth group hosted a soup luncheon and from love offerings donated \$200 to the food bank.

Silent Auction and Special Coffee Hour


Sunday, March 18, 2018


