PASTOR'S MESSAGE

FOOD FOR THOUGHT....a note from your Pastor Thus says God, the LORD, who created the heavens and stretched them out, who spread out the earth and what comes from it, who gives breath to the people upon it and spirit to those who walk in it: ⁶ I am the LORD, I have called you in righteousness, I have taken you by the hand and kept you; I have given you as a covenant to the people, a light to the nations, to open the eyes that are blind, to bring out the prisoners from the dungeon, from the prison those who sit in darkness. ⁸ I am the LORD, that is my name; my glory I give to no other, nor my praise to idols. See, the former things have come to pass, and new things I now declare; before they spring forth, I tell you of them. Isaiah 42

You know, I never expected that I would have a middle school daughter at this point in my life. But I must confess; it has been a wonderful experience to once again see the world through a child's eyes! Council Corner Karen Ketola


I was inspired at our March meeting. We engaged in discussions of how we can encourage others to connect lives to Christ. What can *we* do? What can *you* do?

One way is our continued support of the Blessing in a Backpack ministry. This ministry involves packing backpacks with food for 225 children in the Grand Ledge School District each week. This provides access to food for the weekend. Our congregation supports the program both financially and physically.

Another ministry we support is the Grand Ledge Food Bank. Immanuel currently has 11 volunteers working at the food bank in the kitchen preparing food orders or in the office interviewing clients. Our congregation donated approximately 1600 food items and 300 non-food items in 2017. The SNL Youth group hosted a soup luncheon and from love offerings donated \$200 to the food bank. These are just two of the many ministries we support with time, talent, and treasure. If you want to become more involved in these ministries, just contact the serving team. 
