FOOD FOR THOUGHT....a note from your Pastor

A voice cries out: 'In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken.' Isaiah 40

This may seem odd to some, but Advent is one of my favorite times of the year. There seems to me to be such a tremendous hopefulness in much of our world that is sorely lacking. It's almost as if we once again believe that with God, anything is possible. Now, don't ask my wife, because she will tell you that I'm a bit of a grinch when it comes to Christmas. However, Advent is a totally different story! But isn't Advent just getting "ready" for Christmas? Well, no, not really. Ok, then how do you explain Advent then?

From the ELCA resource, Sunday's and Seasons: Advent is a season of hoping, waiting, yearning, and preparing, but for what or whom and how? The word "advent" is from the Latin adventus; it means "arrival" or an awaited coming. It's a season of big promises. We wonder, "Will God keep ancient promises or has God forgotten us?" During these four weeks, the future and the past mingle together as we celebrate the Christ who came and is yet to come. Advent is a season largely forgotten by our culture of immediate gratification, and likewise we've forgotten what it means to wait well. In all of this waiting, God is creating desire within us. And we trust it's worth the wait. Along the way, there are a few things for which we're not yet ready, because when God comes close it's almost always accompanied by surprise or scandal. This is God's story. This is our story.

God's story! A story that we are part of because of Jesus. How cool is that! Most times I find it difficult to wait, but for God's promises to be fulfilled, I am eagerly straining forward in anticipation. Yes, I'll wait, but with a sense of hope within me that chases the darkness and provides strength for the journey.

As part of our Advent celebration, we will be using a worship series called "Welcome to the Waiting Room". During Advent, our worship will include other elements such as a prayer wall, hopes and dreams and a couple surprises! All meant to help us anticipate and prepare for God's coming to us again. As we wait, we have time to examine, reflect, ponder and wonder at the mystery that is our God.



Why would God stoop down and become human? How is it that God loves us so much he was willing to send his son to die for us?

Behold, God is doing something new, do you not sense it? Prepare the way! Prepare your hearts and lives! The king is coming and you are part of His story! May you experience Advent like never before as you wait in anticipation of God's surprises.
