

FOOD FOR THOUGHT.... a note from your Pastor Then he called the crowd again and said to them, 'Listen to me, all of you, and understand: <sup>15</sup>there is nothing outside a person that by going in can defile, but the things that come out are what defile. *Mark* 7

There are many studies and books that have been written on the *Art of Listening*. Some sociologists believe that modern society has lost this art for several reasons, one of them being our tendency towards visual stimuli. We watch television with subtitles, the sound off or down low. We text and Facebook and tweet and Instagram messages rather than calling someone on the phone. And we feel like we are communicating better because of these conveniences, but the truth is, nothing can replace face to face conversation. In the more real exchange of real conversation, we hear the emotion and depth in a person's voice. We can empathize with them better and this becomes one of the steps to listening more deeply. Another key step in being a better listener, is to focus on what the other is saying, rather than formulating what you will say back. Active listening means that you are able to discern what message the other person is sending and truly hear what their heart is saying.

Scripture is filled with the word "**Listen**". Jesus uses it quite often before or after his teaching. The Greek word translates as *hear*, *understand*, *obey*, *follow*. How often, I wonder, do we "hear" something and never really listen. How often do we say, "oh yeah, I've heard that before." But then we go on our own way disregarding what we have heard. So, we could say that really listening requires more of us than just our ears.

I believe listening to God and to God's will for our lives, also requires our heart, our body and our ears. It requires our heart because if we are burdened with the worries of our lives, our hearts may be closed and we will have a difficult time focusing on what God wants to say. It requires our bodies, because if we are anxious or agitated, we might not be able to be still enough to listen for God's voice. And it requires our ears; because the noise of the world can get in the way of hearing God's voice calling to us.

Try this; when you are calm, settled, have 10 minutes and a quiet place to sit, read aloud a favorite Bible passage or one at random. Then, ask God to open your heart and mind to His Word and to be able to hear what God would say. And then listen! With your whole being, with all of you. Distractions will come, let them come and go. Your goal is to listen for that still small voice of the one who created you. God is constantly reaching out to us. Can we hear God's message for us? Can we be active listeners of God's desire? Can we follow where God calls us? It all starts with listening. Following is difficult enough, made more so if we are unable to hear. If we practice listening to God, we might find that God's voice rings out clear above the noise of the world. Like the Tanzanian song in our hymnal, #513 says. *"Listen! Listen God is calling, to the world inviting, offering forgiveness, comfort and joy."* 

May we be hearers and doers of God's word. May we find a deeper love of God as we practice listening. And may God reach us with words that transform our lives and bring light into our darkness.

An updated contract with Waste Management was approved and signed which affords us significant savings on trash service with no recycling. Taking care of our recyclables will now be managed within our congregation.

Both Support and Council felt it best to put a pause on the position and it will be evaluated by the end of the second quarter as we keep an eye of our mission plan. Volunteer vocalists will have rehearsal time with Jim and Carmen on hymns and songs of praise.

Much of our meeting centered on our financial picture. Many factors contribute but key is that giving is down. All of the teams have done very well in keeping expenses in check and have made changes to cut costs. We're thankful to many ILC members who volunteer their time, talents and energy to our building and grounds.

We're aware that more items may also need to be adjusted in our mission plan. At our November meeting we prayed and trusted that we would move our ministries forward. How is God moving us to mission? Stewardship is managing all of the resources God provides to us. Pray and trust.
